A. HARM: (2):

On 01/22/2019, this DHS SW went to family home to meet with [REDACTED] mother for a home visit and to address reported safety concerns: Upon arrival to the home for the visit, SW met maternal grandmother (MGM) at the door who reported that Ms. Joseph was not home at that time. SW met with MGM and 4-year-old Ariel in the living room of the home. During the visit, 4-year-old Ariel overheard MGM state that Ms. Joseph was not at home at which time Ariel interjected and stated that her mother was home and was laying on the bed in MGM room. MGM called for Ms. Joseph who entered the living room and completed the home visit with DHS SW and MGM.

When MGM was asked by SW as to why MGM did not disclose that Ms. Joseph was in the home when asked by DHS SW. MGM stated that she was fearful that Ms. Joseph would be in trouble with DHS. SW asked to speak privately with 4 year-old Ariel during the visit, the child reported that Ms. Joseph did not live in the home with them, because papa, MGM's boyfriend would not allow it. When asked where Ms. Joseph was living, Ariel reported that Ms. Joseph lives in a tent. It is reported that [REDACTED] Ms. Joseph can come to MGM home anytime of the day.

[REDACTED] Ms. Joseph has not taken Ariel for a DOE assessment as agreed upon in initial meetings.

SW met with Ms. Joseph on 01/22/2019, Ms. Joseph admitted to drug use and appeared motivated to get treatment for her drug use, but reported that she did not know where to start. DHS SW reviewed the Safe Family Home Report and Service plan that Ms. Joseph received, identified the phone numbers of the agencies Ms. Joseph could call and complete assessments for treatment. A verbal plan was discussed and agreed on 01/22/19 that Ms. Joseph would call Hina Mauka by 01/24/19 to schedule an intake assessment with their agency. Ms. Joseph was non-compliant and did not participate in any of the services in the Family Service Plan.

[REDACTED] After investigating allegations by CASA, meeting with RCG, meeting with Ms. Joseph, and maternal grandmother, DHS determined that mother was not sufficiently participating in the terms of the family service plan and had not engaged the required services to ensure that Ms. Joseph could provide a safe family home for the children. DHS agrees with the CASA motion, and the placement of [REDACTED] Ariel Sellers was changed on 2/8/19. [REDACTED]

A hearing was held in family court on 2/11/19 due to a motion filed by the CASA requesting Family Supervision by revoked, and Foster Custody by granted for [REDACTED] Ariel Sellers. Judge Uale granted foster custody of [REDACTED] Ariel Sellers on 2/11/19.

- Ms. Joseph has not been living in the home as DHS had expected her to be in the home and providing care for children.

Ms. Joseph reported that as a child, Ms. Joseph was put into foster custody along with her siblings at the of 15-years-old. DHS placed Ms. Joseph in a relative foster placement with maternal uncle, Uncle Latham. Ms. Joseph aged out of the system while in foster care. Ms. Joseph reported seeing her mom and dad do drugs; smoke marijuana and meth. Ms. Joseph that as a child, she witnessed domestic violence between her parents and described her childhood as a "okay, and a mix of everything."

She reported using alcohol from the age of 17, but only drinks a few times a year. Ms. Joseph reported smoking cigarettes, a pack a day since she was 16-years-old. In 2016, she reported she began smoking ice and used daily, [REDACTED] She reported using Vicodin pills for a couple of years, but denies any use since 2016.

[REDACTED] Ms. Joseph did an assessment and went in to the Women's Way program, but left after three days. She has stated that she is willing to go back into Women's Way. Ms. Joseph agreed with SW to make an appointment with Women's Way as soon as possible.

During a home visit with Ms. Joseph on 01/25/2019, she disclosed that she made contact with the Women's Way program but was denied an assessment because Ms. Joseph had a history of entering their program and leaving the program on three different occasions.

his girlfriend), was seriously injured in a motorcycle accident in Waimanalo and was taken to the hospital, where he underwent several surgeries over the course of the next few weeks. Maternal Grandmother, RCG, [REDACTED] all informed this writer that Maternal Grandmother was spending a lot of time at the hospital as a result. RCG [REDACTED] reported that Mother was taking care of [REDACTED] Ariel without Maternal Grandmother's supervision as a result

On 2/5/19, the CASA Program filed a Motion for Immediate Review due to concerns that mother was roaming in Waimanalo with known drug users in the presence of Ariel. In addition, mother had not participated in any services and was spending nights at maternal grandmother's home. On 2/8/19, the DHS assumed foster custody of [REDACTED] Ariel and placed them with RCGs Lehua & Isaac Kalua. The motion was heard on 2/11/19 and was granted. .

This writer visited Ariel at Maternal Grandmother's home in Waimanalo on 11/16/18 and 1/23/19. Ariel is a very friendly, talkative, and energetic girl. She is very comfortable around strangers, and immediately referred to me as "Aunty." She loves to play with her toys and with her new puppy (when she was living with Maternal Grandmother). Maternal Grandmother mentioned that she believes Ariel may be developmentally or cognitively "slow," though in the limited time this CASA has spent with Ariel, no obvious issues were observed. At Grandma's house, Ariel shared a bedroom with [REDACTED], which they keep very clean and neat. After [REDACTED] Ariel were placed with RCG on 2/8/19, this CASA visited them at RCG's house on 2/11/19. Ariel was having a tough time with structure, as it seems she did not have any rules or boundaries at Grandma's house and was permitted to eat cereal, candy, and other sugary foods throughout the day. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]. Ariel was not crying when this CASA visited, but RCG reported that when Grandma visited on 2/10/19, Ariel screamed and cried and had to be torn away from her in order for Grandma to leave.
