Brief Case Summary (include child(ren)'s special needs; involvement with family, siblings; relatives):

T [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] Jr., age 6 and 11 months, was placed with a friend and former neighbor of Ms. M [REDACTED]. The foster mother, T [REDACTED] K [REDACTED], reported that T [REDACTED] has had his ups and downs behavior wise. At home, T [REDACTED]' behavior is much better than it was initially, and he has taken on some responsibility in the form of small chores. T [REDACTED] was to be referred for special education testing and it was put on hold because his behavior improved.

Makaha Elementary school counselor, Jill Arakaki, explained that the school felt that T [REDACTED] needed mental health services last and referred him to the Children's Team. The school now feels that the special education testing should be completed. T [REDACTED]' teacher, Wanda Oshiro, reported that T [REDACTED] has potential but he is not meeting it at this time. He takes a long time to complete tasks and gets distracted at times. T [REDACTED] had been attending the first grade at Waianae Elementary School, but he was not able to do grade level work and was held back when he began Makaha Elementary.

Waianae Children's Team case manager, Gabby Pule, indicated that the case was closed last year because T [REDACTED]' behavior had improved greatly. T [REDACTED] was evaluated on 03/20/96 by Dr. Rolando Jubis and diagnosed with Oppositional Defiant Disorder. A treatment plan was developed that included resolution of abandonment issues and reduction of defiant and disruptive behaviors. Due to positive reports from the foster home and from school, the case was closed on 10/14/96.

Child(ren)'s present placement: Date: 10/02/95.

Placement into a DHS Emergency Shelter Home (ESH) was avoided since T [REDACTED] was already residing with Ms. M [REDACTED]'s neighbor, T [REDACTED] K [REDACTED]. At one point, Ms. M [REDACTED] had given her a Power of Attorney to allow Ms. K [REDACTED] to sign medical requests and school forms.

DHS assumed placement responsibility of T [REDACTED] Jr. on October 2, 1995, when he was placed into the DHS Special Licensed home of Ms. M [REDACTED]'s former neighbor, T [REDACTED] K [REDACTED]. He continues to reside in the home with Ms. K [REDACTED], a friend and her friend's children. Ms. K [REDACTED] has set-up some strict guidelines for T [REDACTED] and he has

responded well. Ms. K [REDACTED] is considering the long-term care of T [REDACTED] either through adoption or guardianship. She would be a commitment that she would need to have some serious soul searching before deciding. She is obviously bonded with the child and has very strong feelings for him. She has some close male friends that she trusts that spend time with T [REDACTED], but he mostly spends time with Ms. K [REDACTED]. Visits with mother were allowed up until recently when Ms. K [REDACTED] got tired of Ms. M [REDACTED] coming at odd and sporadic hours.

T [REDACTED]' father, T [REDACTED] M [REDACTED], Sr., has expressed that his daughter is interested in adopting T [REDACTED]. There has been no other interested parties.
