REPORT TO COURT

January 28, 1998

The Department of Human Services (DHS) is requesting that the adoption hearing for A [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] and T [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] Jr., be set aside, and that the hearing regarding Legal Guardianship of T [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] Jr., be set aside. The adoption/legal guardianship hearing is scheduled for February 11, 1998.

A [REDACTED] resides with her siblings, I [REDACTED] R [REDACTED] and K [REDACTED] F [REDACTED] in a foster home. At the time that the adoption hearing was scheduled, it was reported that the foster parents were interested in adopting A [REDACTED], I [REDACTED] and K [REDACTED]. However, the foster parents are not interested in adopting the children, nor are they interested in caring for the children on a long-term basis. DHS is in the process of locating a prospective adoptive home that will adopt all three siblings together. A [REDACTED], K [REDACTED] and I [REDACTED] are very close; it would be in their best interests to be adopted together, if at all possible.

T [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] Jr., resides in a foster home; he is the only foster child in that home. The foster parents are not interested in adopting T [REDACTED] but may be interested in providing long-term foster care. The foster mother appears to be the parent interested in providing long-term foster care; the foster father appears to acquiesce to his wife's desire. DHS needs to assess the foster parents' motivation and commitment to T [REDACTED]. If both foster parents are not committed to caring for T [REDACTED], the probability of a disrupted placement increases, particularly in light of T [REDACTED]'s behavioral problems.

In April 1996, [REDACTED] was diagnosed with [REDACTED]. The Wai'anae Children's Team closed his case in October 1996, as his teachers and foster parents reported an improvement in his behavior. However, Maili Elementary will be requesting 504 services for [REDACTED]; 504 would entitle services for [REDACTED], even though he does not qualify for special education. Services are being requested due to [REDACTED]' aggression in the classroom. A meeting in regards to 504 services will be scheduled by the Department of Education.

It is DHS' recommendation that the adoption hearing for A [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] be set aside. It is also recommended that the adoption/legal guardianship hearing for T [REDACTED] M [REDACTED] Jr., be set aside as the goal for T [REDACTED] needs to be identified.
