ASSESSMENT:

Children: B [REDACTED] (age 16 years) was sent off to Utah's Benchmark residential treatment program on 3/5/99. He was accompanied by his probation officer and the DOE representative. While en route, he did think of running, but did not. I have not received any reports on his placement yet, but it has only been 6 weeks.

T [REDACTED] (age 9 years) is still in placement with J [REDACTED] T [REDACTED]. The plan is to transfer PC to him (he takes PC over most of his teenage boys who are placed with him). During this review period, there was a misunderstanding between the school and Mr. T [REDACTED], and I was asked to intervene. I attended the IEP for T [REDACTED] and met with all of the service providers, and

clarified things with them. I then had the DHS social worker contact T [REDACTED] therapist for clarification and setting of certain schedules. I have not heard any complaints since. T [REDACTED] is doing very well in his placement. He recently got to go on a trip to the Big Island with foster father, who is considering moving up there. T [REDACTED] is receiving a battery of services related to his therapy and educational needs.

The Casey Family Program accepted C [REDACTED] (age 11 years), A [REDACTED] (age 10 years), I [REDACTED] (age 7 years) and K [REDACTED] (age 5 years) into their program and had all 4 of them placed together in one of their foster homes. They are happy to be together, and are very happy to be in that home. They began referring to it as their permanent home immediately. The children are in good health, and all are at Waianae Elementary where they are doing satisfactorily. They did have several visits with B [REDACTED] before he left for Utah, and also have had visits with T [REDACTED] on occasion. One item of concern was that a maternal relative lives next door, saw the children, questioned them and called their mother in Las Vegas. Mother has not, however, caused any problems thus far (she had contacted the children in their previous foster homes and made all kinds of representations and promises which she obviously could not keep, and this was having a detrimental affect on the children).

Agencies: DHS will transfer PC of T [REDACTED] to Mr. T [REDACTED], and PC over the 4 children to The Casey Family Program at the upcoming hearing. The Casey family is interested in adoption. As to B [REDACTED] he will eventually be transitioned back to Hawaii, but that could take up to a year, at which time he will be 17 years old, with 1 more year for independent living training and educational/vocational support.


Permanent Plan: The existing Permanent Plan is sufficient.
