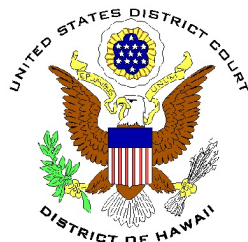
**COURT ACTION: PROVISIONALLY GRANTING MOTIONS TO FILE
RESPONSES UNDER SEAL**

The government and Jamey Denise Jackson (“Jackson”) have each filed a motion seeking leave to file under seal their responses to the underlying motion filed by Public First Law Center (“PFLC”). *See* ECF No. 9 (government’s motion); ECF No. 11 (Jackson’s motion); ECF No. 1. (underlying motion). The government also seeks leave to file its response *ex parte*. *See* ECF No. 9. PFLC does not oppose temporary sealing of the government’s and Jackson’s responses. *See* ECF No. 12.

ECF Nos. 9 and 11 are provisionally granted pending resolution of PFLC’s underlying motion. The court finds that permitting the government’s and Jackson’s responses to be filed *ex parte* and under seal is necessary to avoid mooting the central merits issue raised in PFLC’s underlying motion—that is, whether any or all of the information contained in the sentencing documents at issue, ECF Nos. 264, 335, 336 in Cr. No. 22-00093-JMS, should remain under seal.

Accordingly, the court will docket—*ex parte* and under seal—the unredacted responses already provided to chambers. In addition, the redacted responses already filed by the government and Jackson, ECF Nos. 10 (government’s redacted response), 11-1 (Jackson’s redacted response), shall remain on the docket.
