

CIRCUMSTANCES AND NATURE OF PAROLE VIOLATIONS

It is alleged that parolee JURY did violate the terms and conditions of his parole in the following manner:

1. In violation of Rule #1d, parolee JURY did have in his possession and control methamphetamine on 8/14/25.

Supporting Evidence:

On file is the HPA Substance Abuse Admission Form dated 8/28/25, which indicates that parolee JURY admitted to ingesting methamphetamine on 8/14/25.

2. In violation of Rule #1d, parolee JURY did have in his possession and control methamphetamine on 8/17/25.

Supporting Evidence:

On file is the HPA Substance Abuse Admission Form dated 8/28/25, which indicates that parolee JURY admitted to ingesting methamphetamine on 8/17/25.

3. In violation of Rule #8 Special Condition #5 (B5), parolee JURY failed to participate and remain in the Ho'omau Ke Ola Residential treatment program until completion.

Supporting Evidence:

On file is the HPA Chronological Entry of Contacts, which indicates on 5/7/25, parolee was paroled from HCF directly to Ho'omau Ke Ola treatment program. On 9/29/25, the Parole Officer received a telephone call from the Ho'omau Ke Ola counselor, [REDACTED], stating that parolee JURY was discharged from the program on 9/29/25. A discharge letter is forthcoming.

4. In violation of Rule #3, parolee JURY failed to report to and maintain contact with his Parole Officer on 9/30/25.

Supporting Evidence:

On file is the HPA Chronological Entry of Contacts, which indicates that parolee JURY was instructed to report to the office on 9/29/25 and never reported. His future report date was scheduled for 9/30/25. He failed to report on that date and thereafter.

5. In violation of Rule #5, parolee JURY failed to keep his Parole Officer informed of his whereabouts when he failed to notify of his change of address from [REDACTED] to an unknown address.

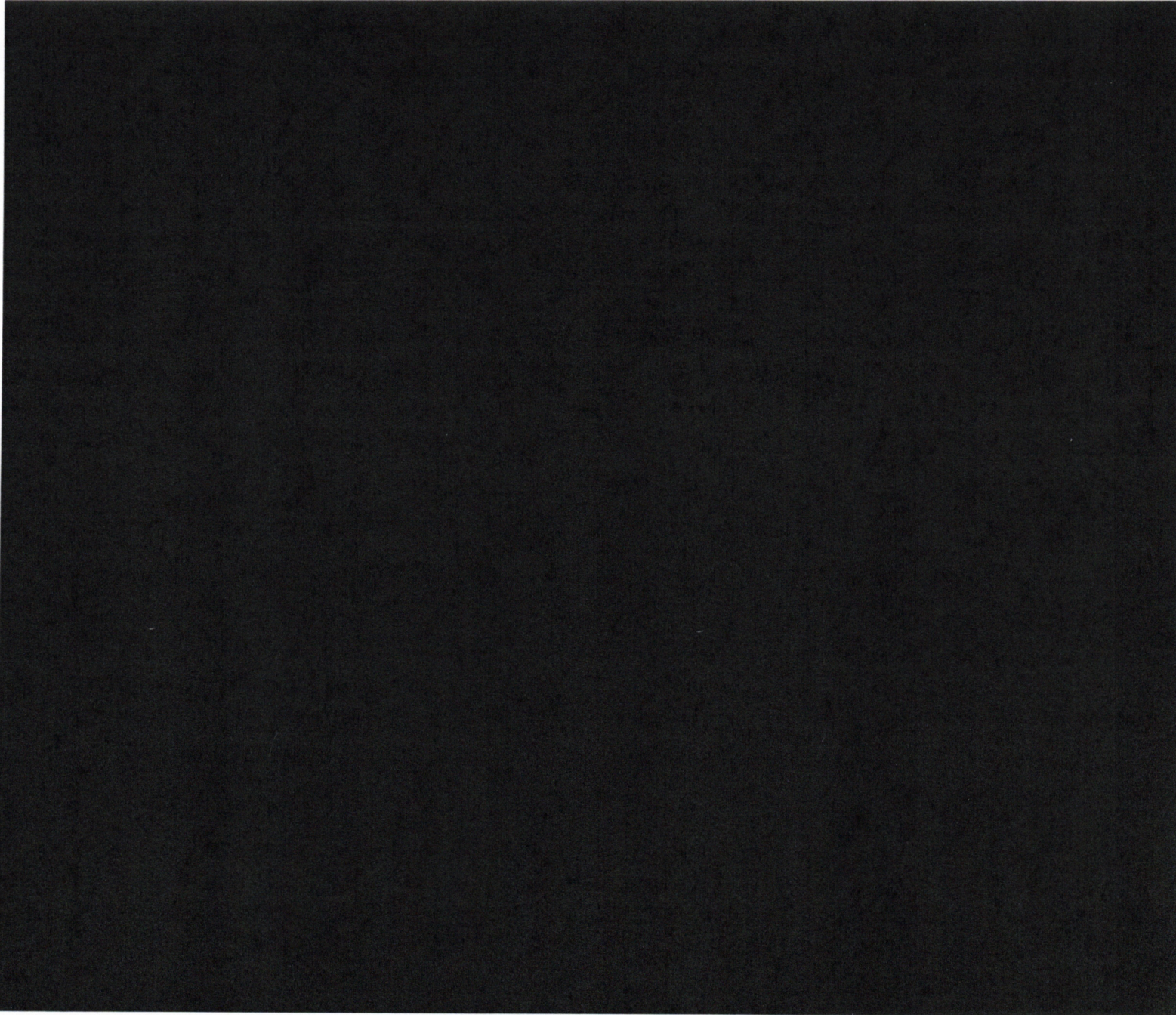

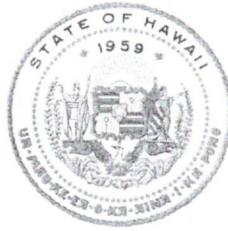
